

On March 21, 1989, Mark Stowe, Assistant Clubhouse manager, Cincinnati Reds, was contacted at the Reds facility at Plant City, Florida by Kevin M. Hallinan and Joseph E. Daly. Stowe was advised he was being contacted concerning the allegations of gambling on the part of Red Manager Pete Rose. He furnished the following information:

He is acquainted with Paul Janszen and Danita Marcum and he last saw them sometime last summer when Stowe, his wife, and their new baby went to lunch with Janszen and Marcum. At that time Janszen said Rose owed Janszen "tons of money" and Janszen said Rose had bet on baseball.

Rose told Stowe that Janszen is saying Rose owes Janszen money when it is Janszen's bookie who owes the money to Janszen. Rose said he was betting through Janszen and when Rose won, the bookie didn't pay Janszen. Rose said if it was Rose's bookie it would be different, but since it wasn't, Rose said he didn't owe Janszen anything. Stowe indicated he didn't have any further information concerning financial dealings between Rose and Janszen.

Rose also told him Janszen is saying Rose bet on baseball but he (Rose) didn't.

Stowe said he has no knowledge of Rose betting on baseball.

Regarding Rose's association with Janszen, Stowe heard Janszen went to baseball card shows with Rose and was Rose's bodyguard.

Regarding Mike Bertolini, he has a company called Hit King Marketing which runs baseball card shows. Bertolini was around Rose often obtaining autographs of Rose. Bertolini isn't liked by many baseball players including Tommy Helms, Bo Diaz, Kal Daniels and Barry Larkin and he has heard Bertolini owes Daniels and Larkin money.
